Dear Ms. Solberg:

On June 16, 2014, I submitted a written request for the North College Park Citizens Association (NCPCA) to be included in the design and review process. After not receiving any response from SHA, I called the project manager, Moreshwar B. Kulkarni, to make certain our request had been received. During the conversation, I reiterated NCPCA's desire to be part of the process and requested that we receive the schedule /time line for the project, minutes of meetings with outside parties and other correspondence related to the scope of the project. Mr. Kulkarni stated that after two hours there would be a charge. I asked if our request was being treated as a Public Information Act request and Mr. Kulkarni stated yes. Therefore, I requested that Mr. Kulkarni provide me with a list of responsive documents and I would let him know which we wanted to "purchase." Subsequently, I received a phone call from Mr. Kulkarni in which he stated that our request for information would need to be submitted in writing and that a letter was preferable to an email.

The City of College Park in a letter dated May 29, 2014, requested that the City be placed on the project mailing list and afforded the opportunity to participate in the process. To date, the City has not received any correspondence or information on the project.


We are extremely disappointed that SHA has taken a position of exclusion with our community. North College Park is the community closest to the proposed project. Our community participated in the process when the original alignment of the Interchange was designed. Changes to the design may have detrimental impacts for our neighborhood and we thought that SHA would prefer involvement on the front end rather than a conflict after a new design is completed.

We ask that you reconsider inclusion of NCPCA and the City of College Park in the design and review process. In the interim, please send to my attention the project timeline/schedule,

minutes of design/review meetings and correspondence from Reynard, Garth Beall, or WMATA that discusses traffic volumes and changes to the project alignment previously approved by SHA.

Finally, I would like to invite you, or another SHA representative familiar with the Interchange Project, to speak to our civic association on Thursday October 9th at 8 p.m. If you have any questions you may reach me at 240-965-0214 or cnagel_70@yahoo.com.
